KENYA Land of Mystery and Marvels




This is what we'll wake to on our first day in Amboseli. Majestic Mount Kilimanjaro!!! Made famous by so many books and films ... NO, we won't be climbing it!!!! :>) Will you be experiencing this view with us???

Aside from the dramatic views of Kilimanjaro, the highest freestanding mountain in the world, and highest peak in Africa, Amboseli is famous for its big herds of elephants ... and we'll have a front row seat to see them in action! You'll be amazed by how they interact with each other, how they care for the little ones, and how they greet other herds. In 1948, Amboseli was formalized as a National Game Reserve, declared a national park in 1974, and declared a UNESCO-Mab Biosphere Reserve in 1991. It is the second most popular reserve in Kenya after the Maasai Mara (where we'll be staying later).

November through March is their summer with temps ranging from 68F to 94F.

Again, we'll be staying at Ol Tukai and when not out on a game drive you may sign up for a relaxing massage or perhaps a drink at the bar. Yes, to those of you who keep asking about that, there is a VERY nice bar!!! :>) We may see the Maasai Moran Warriors dancing and singing their battle songs around a bon fire.





More important information: Check your passports NOW! Your passport must be valid for 6 months after leaving Kenya ... that means until mid-May 2023. If it's not, renew NOW! The Passport Office is backed up and it may take 3 months or longer to get that renewal. You must

have a valid passport to get your Kenyan Visa (which is only valid for 90 days) and may also take a while to get! You'll need 2 empty pages in your passport for that Visa – more on that later.

T-shirts, shorts, sneakers, baseball caps ... all fine and quite acceptable!
