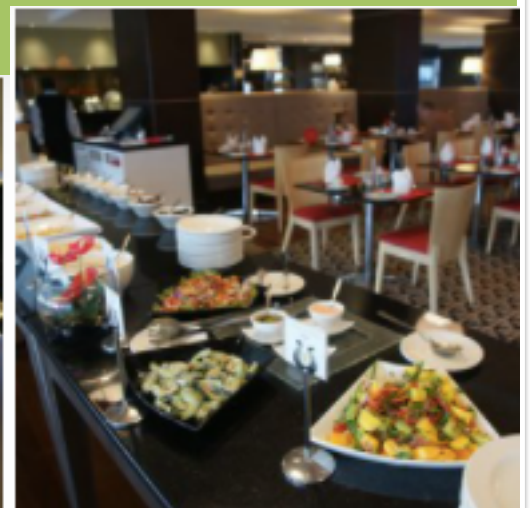


KENYA!

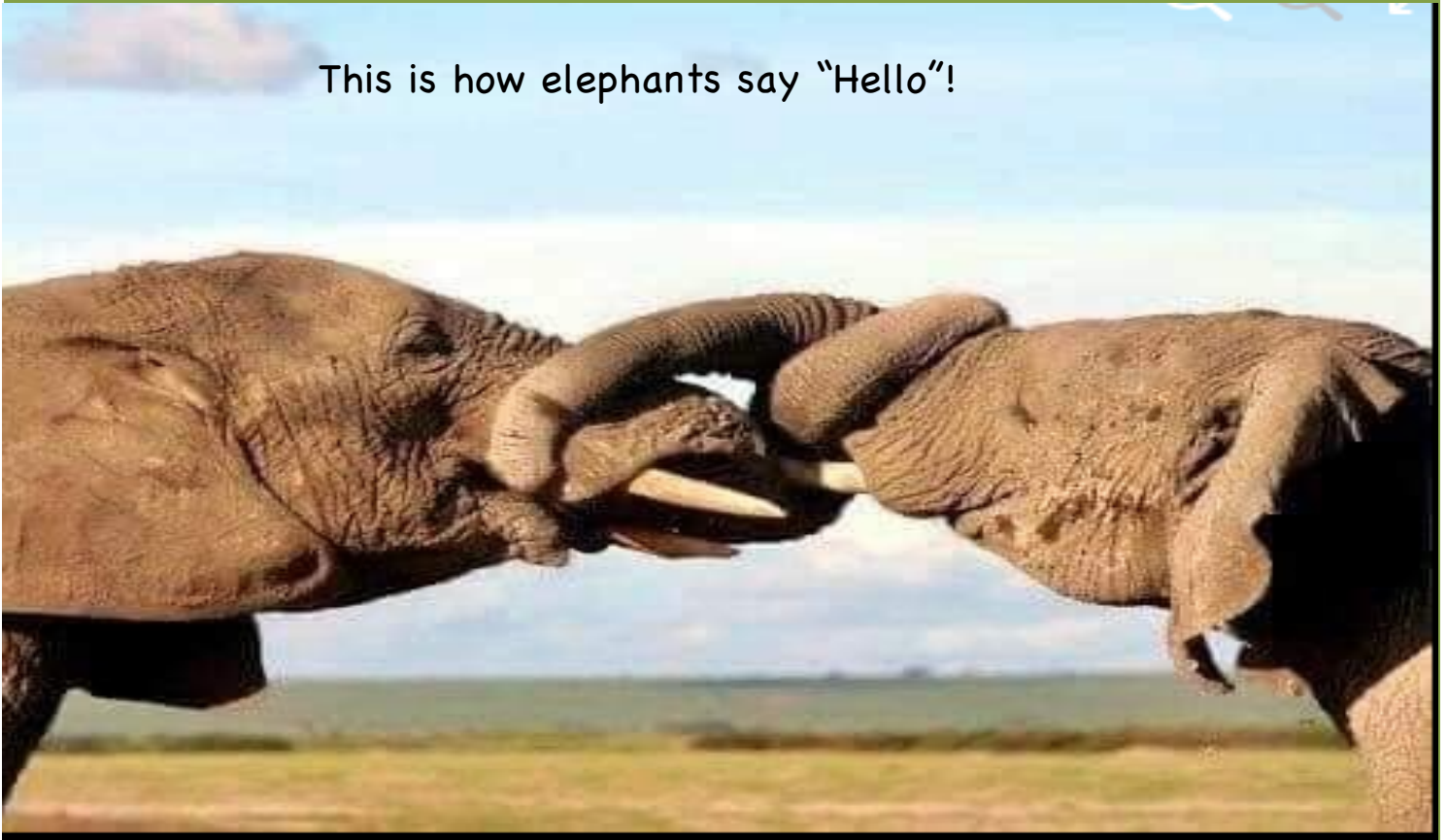
