As an example, NY to London is 6 hours. We will have a bit of a layover in London, but we then fly London to Nairobi, which is 8-3/4 hours. Now I wear compression sox on most long flights.

As mentioned before, luggage space is limited. One large soft-side suitcase, one carry-on, and perhaps a camera bag. This VERY short clip will show you the amount of space we have in the vehicles.
