Mom and her kid! So sweet ...





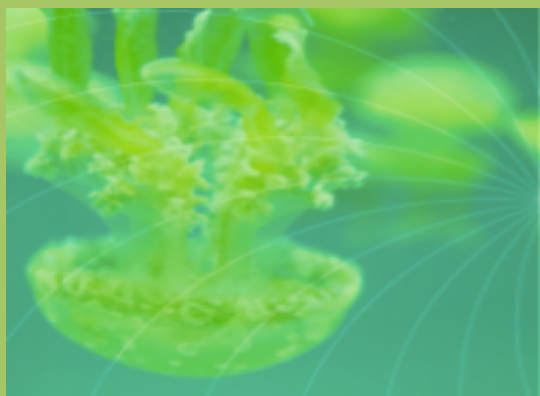
As promised, there will be a pool!!! Nice way to relax after the afternoon game drive ... then a drink at the bar and off to dinner!
